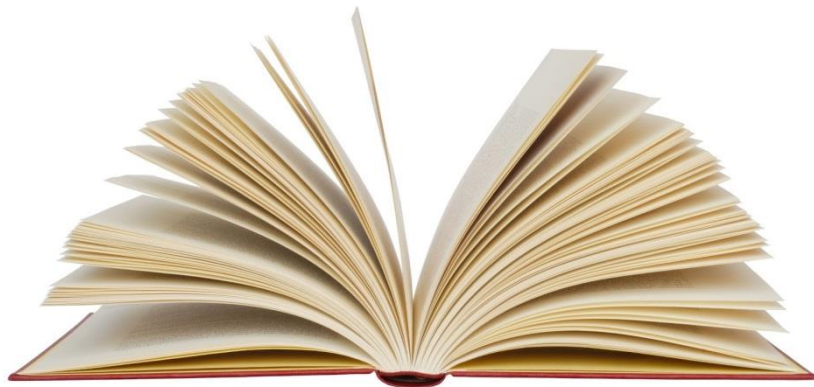

Activities to do at home

Match Report	Writing, or even recording, a report of a recent sports game.
Story-teller	Encouraging your child to develop an ongoing story book where they can keep their fiction ideas.
Diary Writing	Keeping a daily, weekly, holiday or weekend diary can be a useful tool to encourage children to write frequently.
Sensory spelling	If your child finds spelling a challenge, perhaps consider spelling with large felt tip pens, paint or even in foam!
Comic strip	Encourage your child to develop their photography skills as well by creating a fun story through photos and captions!
