Topic: 'Why do Meerkats live in South Africa'

	<p>Practise the time on this game: https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/116/telling-the-time</p> <p>Year 2: Don't forget to practise times table rock stars</p>
	<p>Become a shape detective! Go on a shape hunt and record how many different 2D and 3D shapes you can find in the environment. Challenge: Can you list the properties of the shapes? e.g. How many sides, corners etc.</p>
	<p>Play 'shops!' Make a shop at home and ask people to visit it and play with you. Make sure they pay with the correct amount of money. You may even need to give them some change. Make receipts for the people who visit your shop. Challenge: Could you use a number line (could be an empty number line) to work out how much people need to pay or how much change you need to give?</p>
	<p>Can you write an information text about the big five animals in South Africa! (This can be done as a poster, computer presentation or written form)</p>
	<p>Poem of the day. Read a poetry book. Pick your favourite poem to share with the class. Practise performing your poem at home using a clear, loud voice. Can you explain why you like the poem? (If you can find any with an African or South African theme that would be great!)</p>
	<p>Write the instructions of how to make a Christmas decoration. (You will need: equipment list, headings, numbers, 'bossy verbs', time connectives etc.)</p>
	<p>Create a Christmas tree decoration to hang on your Christmas tree.</p>
	<p>Design a pattern for your own dashiki (typical top worn by both African men and women).</p>
