
VIPER Reading Questions - Captain Tom

ANSWERS

1. Spitfire and hurricane planes (1 mark)
2. Answer may include: Personalised telegram from the Queen, special title of Honorary Colonel, birthday aerial salute from RAF, a message from the Prime Minister (1 mark)
3. Answer may include: headline, subheading, paragraphs, direct quotes, picture with caption, use of third person and past tense (1 mark)
4. Answer should refer to someone who is normally, or usually humble or does not think a lot of themselves, or is unassuming of their achievements (1 mark)
5. Answer should discuss along themes of Tom being humble/modest or thankful/happy, that he doesn't think it is much different to before, he doesn't think it is very different to being 99. Must refer to text for both marks (2 marks)
