

# KS1 Enrichment Activities

## Topic: 'From Dunnington to Mumbai'

	<p>Year 1: Practise counting in 2s to 24 or even beyond! If you can do it forwards can you do it backwards?</p> <p>Year 2: Practice your number bonds to 10 and 20 by playing the Hit the Button Games 'Make 10' or 'Make 20': <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</a></p>
	<p>Year 1: Have a go at measuring things around your house in cm using a ruler. How many things in your bedroom can you measure?</p> <p>Year 2: <a href="https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/hundredSq/index.html">https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/hundredSq/index.html</a> - go to puzzle section on screen which then uses place value knowledge to add 10 more/less and 1 more/less Get someone in your family to say a number between 1 and 30, can you tell them 1 more and 1 less? 10 more, 10 less? Can you write out some to share with the class?</p>
	<p>Year 1: Try playing this place value basketball game: <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/place-value-basketball">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/place-value-basketball</a></p> <p>Year 2: Go to Gig Mode on Times Table Rock Stars and see how you get on.</p>
	<p>Year 1: Practise learning your tricky words on Phonics Play by playing the Tricky Word Trucks game: <a href="https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/">https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/</a> or turn the tricky words into a game hiding them around the house or writing them with chalk on a path (a full list can be found on the website).</p>
	<p>Write a letter to Father Christmas including a list of what you could like for Christmas. Don't forget to ask how he is and tell him how good you've been!</p>
	<p>Research some facts about India. This could be about an Indian holiday destination or a particular city.</p>
	<p>Write a postcard home from a place you have researched in India. Imagine you are there, and write, what it looks like, what you did there, places you visited, the weather, animals you saw and food you ate.</p>
	<p>We have put some Indian recipes on Seesaw and the website for you to see that are linked to the Muslim festival of Eid-ul-Fitr. Why not have a go and post your results on Seesaw?</p>
