

KS1 Enrichment Activities

Topic: Trains, Planes and Automobiles



1. Choose at least one homework activity from each section.

Activities I have chosen	Homework Activity Choices
	<p>Year 1: Practise you position and direction knowledge by either creating an obstacle course or board game and directing someone around it (you could make it train, plane or car themed) AND/OR playing this game online https://pbskids.org/peg/games/hungry-pirates. (Focus on: left, right, forward, backwards, quarter turn, half turn).</p> <p>Year 2: We are going to be learning time to five-minute intervals. Have a go at the following game to get some practice in! https://www.topmarks.co.uk/Flash.aspx?f=matchingpairstimev3 You can choose the time intervals and make your way through it as quickly or as fast as you like!</p>
	<p>Year 1: Recap your knowledge of subtraction by teaching a lesson to your teddies all about subtraction! Can you show them what the symbol is? Can you explain how to do it using objects? Why not get someone to film you for Seesaw.</p> <p>Year 2: Why don't you try to do the same as the year 1s but instead of teaching your teddies you could teach your mums and dads about multiplication and division!</p>
	<p>Year 1: Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. You could play number tennis, bounce a ball for each number or draw them out on the ground. If you can do it forwards can you do it backwards?</p> <p>Year 2: Now is a really important time of year to get regular times table practice! Please go on Times table rock stars and keep going through the levels.</p>
	<p>Year 1: Keep a colourful list of your favourite new words! When you learn a new one, add it in and then try to use it all day when you talk! You could learn a word of the week at home and could even tell me your favourite new words in school.</p> <p>Year 2: Try to write the meaning of any new words you come across when you're reading. Can you look in a Dictionary or Thesaurus to find out what it means? With parent supervision you could look online to find the meaning of the word too!</p>
	<p>Year 1 and 2: Find a poem you like a practise performing it at home. Remember to think about the volume and expression in your voice, you could even add actions too! When you've finished post a video of your performance on Seesaw.</p>
	<p>Year 1 and 2: Write a fact file about trains, planes, cars or any other form of transport you like best! Remember to include subheadings and why not try to include exclamation marks too!</p>
	<p>Year 1 and 2: Go for a walk around York and the surrounding area to spot clues of how transport has changed over time. You could discover where old railway lines are, spot out of use signal boxes or even see a statue of York's famous railway pioneer. Why not take some picture to post on Seesaw to share your findings.</p>
	<p>Year 1: Have a go at building your own weather station at home and recording the weather. Visit this website to get started: https://www.metoffice.gov.uk/weather/learn-about/met-office-for-schools/other-content/other-resources/weather-station/index</p> <p>Year 2: Can you practice the continent song and find three countries in each continent. You could draw a map to present it or just write them down. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=K6DSMZ8b3LE</p>
	<p>Year 1 and 2: Practise your cricketing skills at home! You could practise batting and fielding or play the 'Heads, Shoulders, Knees and Toes Game' where you have to throw the ball up and touch either heads, shoulders, knees or toes before catching it.</p>
