

Primary School Sport Funding Report 2017

The level of funding for Dunnington CE Primary School for the academic year 2016/17 was £9105

With some festivals, such as the netball we 3 teams represented school, experiencing inter-school competition. 'Chance to Shine' cricket coaching contributed to the success of our cricket teams. We fielded two Y5/6 cricket teams with one team reaching the North Yorkshire finals and coming 4 th overall. Our Y3/4 team also secured a place in the North Yorkshire finals.
		45 children took part in the York Cross country event at Huntington and 8 children progressed through to the North Yorkshire round held at Dalby Forest.
		Our Y5/6 football team won the York League. 18 children from Y6 represented school in the sports hall athletics event and reaching the York finals.
		A range of extra- curricular clubs have been provided by school staff and the PE specialists this year. Club lists are always full with reserves.
		We have increased the opportunities for SEND children this year. Six children attended a day of multi sports specifically designed to cater for a range of disabilities. We were booked in for a second SEND event but the weather saw this being cancelled.
		2 members of staff and their classes accessed a six week block of FA skills training provided by York City FC to further enhance their curriculum teaching and build ideas for planning. They also provided girls after-school football coaching, enabling us to take part in 2 girl's football festivals in the city.

		Six teachers had specialist support in their identified area of weakness in the PE curriculum. Evaluation forms were collected from teachers and specialists in order to ensure the package was delivering what was needed and could be tailored to suit our staff and classes. Our PE coordinator was released to provide support for one member with games skills development and then followed this up with observations to ensure skills/ideas learnt were being put into practise. Year 5 play leaders promote physical activity and organise games each lunch
		activity and organise games each lunch time with the younger children. This helps promote healthy lifestyles and contributes to us achieving the School Games Gold Award (third successive year).
