I teach recorder and violin in Dunnington Primary School, and today gave the children a demonstration of these instruments. I am pleased to let you know that I now have spaces for new pupils, both in individual and group lessons.

Learning a musical instrument teaches new skills and can be very enjoyable and rewarding.

Lessons are carefully tailored to suit each child's needs, and delivered in an encouraging and motivational environment with an emphasis on learning and enjoyment. Pupils learning at school have the opportunity to share lessons or learn in small groups, reducing costs and adding to enjoyment through learning with friends.

Lessons cost £4.50 for a group lesson, and £9 for an individual lesson. Bursaries are available where appropriate and covers the entire cost of small group lessons. Instrument Hire is available through York Arts Education.

I am writing to inform you about the Year 5 residential trip to Low Mill Outdoor Activity Centre in the village of Askrigg. The dates for the trip are Wednesday 8th to Friday 10th May and as these dates have been reserved, I am now keen to confirm the number of children wishing to go on the trip as soon as possible.

The activities will be spread over three days and will hopefully include abseiling, caving, gorge walking and canoeing. Although some of these activities may seem a little daunting at first, all the children (and indeed teachers) on past visits have taken part and found them incredibly rewarding. We have all gained in confidence and returned to school with a real sense of achievement. In addition to this, it is ideal preparation for the longer residential visit which takes place in Year 6.

The total cost of the visit this year is £175. This amount includes the activities, coach travel, meals, 2 nights of accommodation and the use of the centre's minibuses. The balance can also be made in instalments over time if you prefer. This year, there will also be the added benefit of being able to pay using Parentpay.

Dear Parents / Carers,

On Friday 9th November the Year 3/4 children will be attending an event themed, '100 Years, 1000 Voices' to commemorate 100 years since the end of World War One. 1000 children from across York have been invited to sing songs from the wartime era in front of an audience of invited guests, which includes the Mayor of York. The children are currently enjoying learning classic tunes such as 'Keep the Home Fires Burning' in preparation for this choral event.

The concert will take place at Central Hall at the University of York during the school day, with a rehearsal in the morning taking place from 10:45am and the whole concert finishing around 2:15pm. Children will need to bring a packed lunch with them as they will be eating lunch at the venue before the start of the afternoon's concert. A drinks bottle containing water will also be needed. Children should wear their shool uniform for this trip and their normal school shoes.

We also need some parent helpers to come with us on the day. In the event of multiple offers, we will pull names out of hat to ensure this is fair. We really appreciate any offers of help. Please indicate on the form if you are willing and available! We will get back to you once all the letters are in. Unfortunately, this is not a ticketed event and parents are not able to attend to listen to the concert. We are hoping however, that we can arrange for parents to listen to some of the songs. Further details of this will be given at a later date.

We would like to ask for a voluntary contribution of £4.31 per child to cover the cost of the trip. Forms should be returned to school by Monday 5th November with any cheques made out to 'South York MAT'. Additionally, there will be some photographs and videos taken on the day. Any photographs taken may be used by Creative Learning Partnerships, City of York Council, York Music Hub and other partners on social media, via websites and/or printed material. Images will be stored securely. Creative Learning Partnerships will share them with participating schools. If you do not wish your child to appear in any photos or videos during the event, please indicate on the form below. Please note that members of the audience are free to take photographs of the performance as it is classed as a public event. Schools may independently take photographs/video and share them on their social media streams or newsletters.

We are really looking forward to this event, and know it will be a memorable and special occasion for the children. We are using this as an opportunity to learn a bit about World War One. For the event, the organisers would like schools to bring in an artefact which links to the war. If you have anything significant, such as an artefact, a photo or a letter at home which you would be willing to let us borrow, please email Miss Dunn directly. Any offers are greatly appreciated!


