

My 5 day weather chart

Day of the week	Rainfall- use your rain gauge (mm)	Wind description or speed (knots)	Temp (in degrees celsius)	Weather symbol

Year 1 and 2 Science challenge

We would like you to have a go at keeping a weather diary for 5 days. You can use our chart or design your own way of recording the information. You might choose to write a few lines every day or create your own chart in your exercise book.

Parents: Your child can use the television weather reports, the internet to find the information or you could create some simple weather instruments for your garden to help you in your mission! A rain gauge is easy to make by using any container with no lid and checking the new measurement every day. A wind sock using a stick and sock or plastic bag could help you decide how windy it is. An outdoor thermometer (that some people have in their gardens) is also a very accurate way to measure the air temperature.

Each day (at the same time if you can) you must:

1. Record the rainfall in mm.
2. Record the wind speed or describe the wind.
3. Record the temperature.
4. Choose a symbol (from our selection) to draw and colour.
