

## Music

Part of a musical education is also knowing about notable composers and famous pieces, as well as learning to really listen to a piece, considering how it makes us feel and how it has been put together.

1. Watch the video where Hans Zimmer explains how he created the piece 'Earth'. Then research other pieces Hans Zimmer has composed (you will find some familiar sounding music on this journey!). You may want to put together a poster about Hans Zimmer
2. Listen to the piece 'Earth' on the website, then complete the listening activity available on the website.
3. Extra activity...with your newfound knowledge on Hans Zimmer, play a game of 'Guess which piece' with your family, where someone sings/hums the piece or taps the rhythm out and the other person must guess which well-known Hans Zimmer composition it is! Perhaps you could make a set of cards with his different compositions on to help with this game?
