## 8. a) Explain, with reference to the text, how Anne’s mood changes throughout the extracts.

Accept answers which reference the several moods shown throughout the extracts with evidence to back this up:

At first, Anne is worried and anxious about her father receiving his call up notice, describing the unpleasant visions she had of what that would mean for her father and describing the silent atmosphere after receiving the news. In a later entry, Anne seems more positive as she describes the layout of the annex and uses positive adjectives like ‘lovely’. In other entries, Anne’s mood changes again. First, she is feeling dismal and depressed about the news of Jewish people being moved to camps. She then describes her fear when the carpenter came to fill the extinguishers saying, “I was so scared I nearly fainted at the thought of this total stranger managing to discover our wonderful hiding place...” In the final entry, her mood seems hopeful as she describes looking at the sky and feeling that “everything will change for the better”.

8. b) Why might Anne's mood change?

Accept an answer which describes the length of time Anne has been in the annex and the situation she has been placed in. Accept answers which show an understanding of the circumstances the Franks are in, the number of people in a small space, the horrible conditions for Jewish people at the time or the fear of being found.
