

Year 5 Home Learning - English for week beginning 15.06.20

I know that English, particularly writing, can be challenging for children at home. It is important to remember that the classroom environment, which contributes a lot of support for them to access independently, is not currently available for them, and so motivation to write is likely to be an issue - this is very normal! We will continue to set a range of activities, so that children feel they have different things to choose from. Children, we encourage you to write little and often - to keep those important skills ticking over. All we can ask is that you try your best!

Reading

This week there is a reading comprehension to complete on deforestation. This will help you with preparing for writing a persuasive letter on this subject next week. Try to answer the questions as fully as possible, drawing on the text to help you.

Writing

This term you will learn more about rainforests, such as the Amazon rainforest. Did you know however that rainforests are under real threat? This is due to something called 'deforestation'. In order to write a letter which puts across your point effectively, you must be well researched on the subject first.

Your tasks are:

1. Research deforestation
