

Seeds are often winged so they can be spread by the wind	Trees grow 25-45 metres in height	The air is damp and humid with little rainfall reaching the plants at this level	Plants only get 1-2% of available sunlight
Trees reach 60m in height	Leaves are large to absorb as much light as possible	Plants rarely grow above 10m in height	Almost no plants grow in this layer
Animals = eagles, bats and monkeys	Home to 90% of organisms found in the rainforest	Plants receive 2-15% of available sunlight	Plants rarely grow more than 3.5m in height
Only 1 or 2 in every acre of rainforest	Leaves have pointed tips for rain to drip off	Vines and creepers hitch a lift to sunlight on tree trunks	Decomposing organic matter and leaf litter found here
Tops of these trees can be almost the size of a football pitch	This layer is a layer of leaves around 6 metres thick	Plants have a difficult time with pollination because of lack of air movement	Animals = termites, cockroaches, earthworms, beetles, centipedes
