### Plans for Y3 and Y4 after half term

In line with government guidance, it will be necessary for Mrs Todd and Mrs Jones to continue to work from home following the half term break and for Mrs Priest to also begin to work remotely.

I have therefore asked Lorna Sugden to continue until the summer break so that she can continue to support in Year 3, wherever needed. Miss Sugden continues to do an excellent job, working closely with Mrs Jones and Mrs Todd to ensure that the children in school are able to access the learning that is planned for their class.

I am also pleased to inform you that I have secured the services of Charlie Malarkey to work alongside Mrs Priest in Year 4.

Miss Malarkey very successfully completed her final teaching practice with us last year and has since been working in one of our MAT schools in a support/teaching capacity. Miss Malarkey will work as Teaching Assistant in Year 4 until February half term. She will then lead the Year 4 group/class in school under the guidance and planning of Mrs Priest, whilst Mrs Priest needs to be working from home. Miss Malarkey will then continue to cover the class, once Mrs Priest begins her maternity leave, for the rest of the summer term.

I hope that this will provide as much continuity as possible for the children in both Year 3 and 4, given the uncertainty of the current situation.
