### Teachers' Strikes 27th April and 2nd May 2023

You may have heard on the news that the NEU have announced further dates for industrial action this half-term. This is expected to take place on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April and Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2023.

It is likely that we will be open for some, but not all classes on these dates.

Select the appropriate year group. Pupils can choose any of the lessons contained within that area.

Staff do not have to tell their employer which union they are members of and individual NEU members do not have to tell their employer whether they personally intend to take part in strike action. Therefore, it is very difficult to know the precise impact of the strike until the actual day of the strike. I will endeavour to notify parents as soon as I have a clearer picture but this may need to be by email on the morning of the actual strike days.

School lunches will be provided for those pupils in attendance and for any pupils in receipt of free school meals who are at home. Please contact the school office if you wish to take up this offer.

I'm sorry that you may have to make alternative arrangements for your child at short notice. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect.

The planned 'catch-up' swimming session on 2<sup>nd</sup> May will still go ahead but if your child is in a class affected by the strike action, we will require them to be dropped off at school at 9am and collected at 11:30am. We appreciate that this may not be possible for everyone, dependant on childcare arrangements for the day.
