Children in KS2 should arrive at school between 8:40 and 8:45am. If children arrive during registration but before 9:15am, they are marked as late. **The registers close at 9:15am**, therefore, if a child arrives after this time, they will be recorded as 'late after the register has closed' which shows as an **unauthorised absence** in the overall attendance figures.

Please try to be on time – but better late than never!

## **Medical Conditions and Allergies**

Please let the school office know if there are updates regarding allergies or medical conditions for your child.

#### **School Uniform**

All of the children look incredibly smart in their school uniform – even in the incredibly hot weather last week. Please could you ensure that all of the children's uniforms, including their PE kits and shoes are named to minimise the amount of lost property we have in school. The lost property box is located near the school office – please do pop in and have a look if you are missing something.

Please also make sure your child has a coat/ waterproof with them at school at all times to allow the children to get outside at playtime as often as possible. As we have seen over the last few days, the weather is very changeable and unpredictable at this time of year!

#### **Water Bottles**

The children are encouraged to drink plenty of water throughout the school day so please ensure they have a named water bottle in school. These can be purchased at the school office for £1.20 or supplied from home. We do not provide cups by the water machines as this is not very hygienic. However, if a child has forgotten their bottle, they can borrow a bottle from the staffroom. Please encourage your child to bring their bottles home daily for a good wash!

#### **Nut Free Zone**

For the benefit of parents new to the school, you may have read in our prospectus that our school is a 'nut free zone'. This is because we have a number of children in school who have a severe nut allergy. We therefore ask that all parents **avoid putting nuts or any product that contains whole nuts into packed lunches**. Thank you for your cooperation on this matter.

#### **Sweets in School**

Occasionally children have brought treats and sweets in from holidays and birthdays to share with their friends. Whilst we appreciate this is a really kind gesture, some parents would rather their children didn't eat sweets. It can also be quite time-consuming and difficult for teaching staff to determine which sweets children can have when they have food intolerances/allergies. We therefore request that children don't bring treats into school to share.

## **Bringing Cycles and Scooters to School**

Many children bring their cycles and scooters to school, which is a brilliant, healthy form of transport. In order to keep everybody safe, we ask that children dismount their cycles and scooters before they enter the school gates and walk them to the scooter parks and cycle

sheds sensibly. Please do not allow your child to scooter or cycle in the playgrounds before or after school.

## **Parking around School**

We had a near-miss outside school yesterday, which was obviously incredibly distressing for the child and their family. It is really important that cars do not park/ drop-off on the double yellow lines or zig zags or block neighbouring driveways. Doing this makes it difficult for children to see and dangerous to cross near our school. Your help and consideration would be very much appreciated. For parents new to the school, may I alert you to the fact that Hunter's Way is a private road - please refrain from parking down that street.

## Pupils walking to and from school alone

Parents/carers often wish for pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 to begin to walk, scooter or cycle to and from school on their own. It is for parents to make this decision, not the school, and will depend entirely on the readiness of the individual child and their circumstances.

Please ensure your child is confident with road safety and knows where the safe crossing places are on their route.

If you do not wish for your Year 5 or Year 6 child to walk home on their own, please ensure that their class teacher is made aware of this and is also informed of any future changes to circumstances.

#### **Bug-Busting Week**

As is tradition at Dunnington CE School, the first week of every half term is 'bug busting week'. This approach to the problem has been very effective in working towards the elimination of head lice from our school. We would therefore like to ask for your cooperation in continuing with this regular event. We often have reported cases of head lice in school, so it is important to be vigilant. Please remember that we need every family to participate in order for our efforts to be effective.

## Please proceed as follows:

Starting from today, please check for head lice and eggs and wet-comb the hair of every member of your family at least once every three days for at least one full week. Experts are divided as to whether wet- combing or chemical treatment is best but unless you find lice or eggs, it is better not to treat heads with chemical preparations.

If you are unfamiliar with head lice and would like more information or support about detection and treatment, please contact the school office. Thank you again for your cooperation.
