Our House Point System

In 2018, our school council worked with the pupil body to introduce a new house point system throughout the school. They decided that, on entry to school, all pupils would be allocated to one of four houses: Craven (Green), Rowntree (Yellow), Terry (Blue) or Tuke (Red). The houses were named after famous confectioners in the York area.

House points form a part of our whole school reward system at Dunnington CE Primary School. Events, such as sports day, bring children together to compete in their houses. The house system encourages a team ethos across the school and allows children of all ages to have a common goal.

Whilst we expect all children to be ready to learn, respectful and safe at all times, our house points are used to reward children for 'taking that extra step' for example;

- Helping and caring for others
- Demonstrating high levels of enthusiasm, courtesy, collaboration or cooperation

- Persevering with a challenge
- Striving to improve.

Congratulations to all in **Craven House** who had gained the most points when we broke up for Christmas. Next Friday (19th January) they will have a non-uniform day.

Space Virtual Reality Workshop

Year 5 have had a very exciting start to the term training to be astronauts. Today, alongside year 1 and year 2, they had the amazing opportunity to participate in a space virtual reality workshop.

They told me all about it:

"We split the class in two – half were painting galaxies and half were doing the workshop. In the workshop, we were given VR headsets which we had to hold up to our eyes – a bit like binoculars. At first, it started off in a spaceship that felt like a rollercoaster – at the end of the rollercoaster you got blasted into space!

Then we went through all the planets=- Venus was the most interesting - we learned it was the evil sister of earth. We also learned you can fit 1300 Earths inside Jupiter! Wow! Jupiter has a red spot that can swallow the equivalent of 3 earths at once - it will be gone in 60 years according to scientists. We also learned that we could actually live on Mars because there is water there - there's a possibility that we could turn Mars green in 600 years.

It was an amazingly fun and interesting experience!"
