We are really looking forward to being able to make the most of our amazing grounds and maximise outdoor learning opportunities as the weather continues to improve.

#### **SYMAT** review

We had a review into the maths provision here at Dunnington on Tuesday which was led by staff from other schools across South York Mat. At the start of the day the review team talked to members of the leadership team, they then visited every class to watch lessons and gather staff and pupil voice before looking at the pupils' books and the maths curriculum.

None of you will be surprised to hear that the children did us proud and our visitors commented that we have an absolutely lovely school. The children were said to be extremely polite and a pleasure to speak to and behaviour for learning was thought to be very strong across all classes with children wanting to learn. There was said to be a lovely atmosphere in every class – children learn in an appealing environment, have access to a good range of resources, are given opportunities to self-reflect and are supported by incredibly skilled support staff.

Maths teaching was said to be strong – teachers were able to model effective strategies, were very clear in their explanations, used a good range of vocabulary, were skilled at addressing misconceptions and were able to question the children in order to extend their knowledge.

Whilst it was commented on that teachers know what they are doing and that measurable progress can be seen in every lesson, we were advised to focus on refining our curriculum to allow even more children to achieve greater depth, and more importantly, become confident, well-prepared and

successful mathematicians. This was already an area we had identified as something to focus on and it was really informative to have some discussions about how this may look going forward.

I was so proud to hear this excellent feedback. I know all the staff and children here work incredibly hard and do us proud every day – I was thrilled to hear these thoughts echoed by our visitors.

#### **Farewell Mrs Birkinshaw**

It is with a heavy heart that I have to let you know that Mrs Birkinshaw has taken the decision to retire at the end of the summer term. She has worked at Dunnington for 19 years and has always shown such commitment to the children in her care. She always goes to where support is needed, she works tirelessly to help children in need of extra intervention and she works incredibly hard to help the staff she works alongside. We will all miss you lots Mrs Birkinshaw but we look forward to hearing about the next adventures life will bring.
